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Words from Our National Director

"Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. These commandments that I give you today are to be on your hearts."

Deuteronomy 6:5-6

This message, given by Moses to the people of Israel and given to us in the book of Deuteronomy, has been central in guiding our reflection and mission as CECE throughout 2020. We have explored what it means to remember, love, listen to and choose life as disciples of Jesus in the University and in our workplaces. 2020 has been a very challenging year: the local and global impact of COVID-19, the extended time of quarantine, the loss of loved ones, a deep economic crisis, the change to online study, the negative impact to relational and mental health for many people.

In the midst of these difficult times, it is a great joy to share that CECE has continued to serve with **compassion**, **creativity**, and **constancy** to share **Christ** in the universities.

Currently, we are privileged to work with 50 Student Coordinators who serve and share about Jesus with their classmates every week in their University Group Bible Studies. Throughout the year there has been an average of 30 University Groups proclaiming the gospel and exploring scripture with an average of 187 students participating each week on 25 university campuses in 12 cities throughout the country. Through new contacts who have participated in online workshops during quarantine, four new University Groups have been planted in the cities of Tena, Latacunga, Guayaquil and Milagro. Three groups of Professionals/Alumni continue to meet regularly and 75 profesionales participated in a national online event. We thank God for our Graduate Volunteers who have joined with local student groups to help the ministry with their time and gifts. We also celebrate the growth and impact of the Faith and Art Dialogue spaces. We have been able to respond with compassion to physical needs of students with food packs and their pastoral needs by walking alongside many students and graduates impacted by COVID. With creativity and constancy we have shared and served through over 30 weekly national online spaces which have included celebrations, prayer times and workshops.

This fruitful work has not occurred by itself. While university students are at the heart of mission, there are other members of the CECE team who sacrificially contribute so this witness can take place. Here I must mention the National Board, the Staff Team, the National Student Committee, the Communication Team and our Ministry Partners and supporting churches. Thank you for being part of reaching the University with the gospel. Thank you for being CECE de Corazón!

Ministry to University Students



The heart of CECE's mission is to proclaim, disciple, and send out in service. In the following section, we will share the different spaces and ways we do this as a community.

University Group Bible Studies


University Group Bible Studies are a central part and the core of mission in universities. They are small groups of students that share about Jesus through life in community, acts of service, and weekly investigative Bible studies.



Currently, have we an average of 30 University Group Bible **Studies** meeting in 25 universities throughout 12 cities Ecuador with about 187 students participating every week. This year we explored the books of Deuteronomy and Luke through Bible studies. Due to pandemic, all meetings have been virtual since March, but we have seen a transformative impact in the lives of Christian and non-Christian students who attend consistently.

Another way of proclaiming the gospel has been through workshops organized by each University Group Bible Study with the goal of responding to the specific needs of their classmates. Some topics groups have reviewed are Tips for Successful Study and Livina with the Black Cloud. workshops allow us to share the love of God in very practical ways and strengthen friendships and community. Other workshops focused on proclaiming the gospel during our experience of COVID, for example, Purposeful Conversations and Tips for Self-care during Quarantine.

important Α very part proclamation, discipleship and service occurs within our Pioneer Groups, which are University Group Bible Studies new campuses on universities. Although working with Pioneer Groups has always been a part of CECE's DNA, we have seen increased growth thanks to the guidance and coordination of Staff Worker, Guadalupe Muñoz, began serving in a national role focused on Pioneer Groups earlier this year.



National workshops and social media contacts have been key to connecting with new students. We developed a series of six workshops to train students interested in planting a new University Group Bible Study, which have been wellreceived and have allowed for the development of Student Coordinators committed to facilitating these new groups. Despite the challenges of virtual ministry, we have seen it as a gift from God to be able to plant new groups and, as a result, surpass our goal of establishing three Pioneer Groups per year, planting a total of four in 2020. National Camp

Our National Camp was held from March 4th to 8th in Manglaralto with 118 participants, 24 of them professionals and 20% new students. We also had various students from Pioneer Groups present this year.

"Every day I was at the Camp, God showed me something different from my past, something that had to be healed, overcome, and dealt with to move forward. In the mornings, when I went out for a run, I thought, what will God have to say to me today? With that question, I attended the Tell your story workshop. I never imagined how meaningful it is to tell the story of how God came into your life and, in my case, the story of how God revived my life. I feel challenged to tell my story to others, the story of the Lord telling me: 'I am here and I will remain with you.'"

The goal of National Camp is to strengthen the missionary capacities of university students to live out, share, and dialogue the gospel of Jesus Christ where they study. Throughout the book of Deuteronomy and using the question, "What do you choose?", we shared five days together of devotionals, plenaries, workshops and worship, as well as games and community activities. This year, the Bible expositions were shared by two students, two Staff, and a guest, Ben Carswell, the National Director of TSCF (IFES, New Zealand). We were able to see increased interaction of students from different cities, which has greatly strengthened the sense of community at the national level. We appreciate the excellent work of the CNE, Staff Team, and our expositors.



Faith and Art Dialogue

The Faith and Art Dialogue space began four years ago during the "Responding to the Word" segment and several forums during National Camp. The main objective is to become familiar with and explore the dialogue between art and faith, and thus, reflect the character of our creator God.


During 2020, we have explored topics including: the work of creating, the vocation of the artist, art and social justice, a virtual visit to museums, and a rich dialogue with the text of Deuteronomy in two art exhibitions: one at National Camp and another in a virtual format. Some achievements include: the integration of new students interested in exploring faith through art, offering a place to process the painful experiences of COVID, modeling dialogue between art and the biblical text, and the interaction of around 25-30 participants in the monthly meetings. The challenge ahead is to further integrate art in the evangelistic and discipleship areas of CECE.



Weekly National Space

This space is a national effort that arose during the first weeks of quarantine in the country and grew during April with our CECE de Corazón initiative. Due to the excellent response in participation, every Wednesday night a national gathering was offered including prayer spaces, celebrations, Faith and Art Dialogue, and workshops. We have had 18 workshops throughout the year covering topics such as: A Passion for Learning, In Times of Corona and Quarantine, Tips for Time Management, Lament and Grief, and Conflict Resolution. These workshops developed key elements such as: Bible, prayer, mental health, ministry skills, and the Faith and Arts Dialogue. The workshops have evangelistic, service, and discipleship objectives. Below, you can review a table which gives details about this weekly space.

CECE de Corazón

This year, in April, we developed a new national initiative, CECE de Corazón (Wholeheartedly CECE). Throughout the month, we connected via weekly workshops, two celebratory events, and testimonies shared on social networks with the purpose of celebrating CECE's anniversary and making four areas of ministry visible: Mission in the University, Staff Team, Pioneer Groups, and the CECE House.

We hope that this event will become an annual one, especially when we can celebrate it in-person. We thank God for this initiative that helped us reconnect with our community, reach thousands of new people throughout the month, and establish spaces for discipleship, evangelism, and service during the first weeks of quarantine. Liturgy Workshop







In June, we had 35 individuals participating in our Liturgy Workshop with the theme: "Songs of Lament and Hope". Together we explored the importance of lament from the biblical text as an essential part of living out faith in the midst of a crisis.

InterVarsity Virtual Visit

InterVarsity/USA Global Programs initiative, "We are IFES", organized virtual visits to student movements to learn about the reality and ways of doing ministry around the world. CECE hosted two virtual meetings on July 8th and 10th. It was a time sharing mission stories of encouraging each other in the faith through testimonies, prayer, and music. For us, student exchanges (even virtually) are a way strengthen relationships with sister movements and thus, to learn more about IFES.

National Student Leader Formation Event (EFE)

On September 4th and 5th, 90 Student Coordinators (25 new), Graduate Volunteers, and the Staff Team participated in EFE. The event title was: "Nurturing the Heart of the Student Leader". Through Zoom, we shared plenaries and workshops to strengthen CECE identity and our sense of community in mission. We explored the leadership of Moses, mental health issues, healthy relationships, and ministry skills such as planning and facilitating University Group Bible Studies. We also participated in community spaces including art, cooking, exercise, and games. Students were trained and challenged to carry out the mission in their own universities.

World Student Day

Every year, in October, we participate in World Student Day, which brings together our global movement to celebrate what God is doing in the world's universities through IFES. On this day, we pray for each other and for the needs and opportunities of the coming year. The 2020 theme was "Far and Near." COVID-19 has impacted the educational context for everyone. It has changed the shape of our mission, but not its heart.

As CECE, we organized a national celebration and participated in a prayer night with the Andean sub-region (Colombia, Peru, Bolivia and Ecuador), with about 160 participants. Some University Group Bible Studies connected with other IFES movements to learn about the context of mission in different countries. Others, in their weekly meetings, devoted time to pray for their universities, for Ecuador, and for the mission in universities around the world. We are always encouraged to belong to this great family.



Fondotón 2021: Fondotón From Home

Fondotón changed its presentation, but not its heart. Fondotón From Home was held on Saturday, November 14, with 145 registered participants, and 120 participants connected during the live event. Students, professionals, Staff Workers, families, and Ministry Partners connected via Zoom for an hour of exercise, stretching, dance, and nutritional tips.

Preparing for Fondotón From Home, we had a series of nine challenges in our #FondotonChallenge through TikTok and Instagram. We saw great interaction on social media and the excitement of our students as they completed and shared the challenges. We reached more than 15,000 views on Instagram Reels with this initiative.

The goal was to raise \$1,000, and God provided \$1,200! We were very encouraged by this virtual fundraising experiment and we praise the Lord for His provision. Ministry to Professionals/Alumni

In order to explore the relationship between faith and work from the Scriptures, we have continued to work with professionals. Three groups have met weekly or biweekly in Quito, Riobamba and Guayaquil, with an average of 26 participants. Materials such as: Where is God on Monday?, They will have new strength, Boundaries, Community life, Letters to Malcolm, and Studies from John's Gospel have been reviewed. In order to keep connected with Local Groups through concrete support, we appreciate the constant presence of professionals in local and national activities such as celebrations, prayer times, national workshops, Fondotón, etc.




Communications Team
