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## **Words from the National Director**

2022 has been a year marked by the transition from surviving the pandemic, to processing it, and together with Job expressing our lament, pain and honest questions to God. We have walked with Job in his suffering and learned how to live as a community on mission, with integrity, suffering and wisdom. Along with the questioning we have been challenged to trust the Creator God, who speaks from and in the midst of the storm. Together with Job we can say:

" I know that my redeemer lives, and that in the end he will stand on the earth." (Job 19:25)

> "My ears had heard of you but now my eyes have seen you." (Job 42:5)

Even in the midst of a reality affected by changes in the educational system, uncertainty, and an economic and social crisis, we have seen and experienced God's support in the mission in the country's universities. Currently, we have 40 student coordinators, who serve and proclaim Jesus with their peers every week in 25 active University Groups (GU), with an average of 128 students participating weekly, in 25 universities in 12 cities across Ecuador. With creativity and perseverance, we have proclaimed and served with Bible studies, workshops, spaces to build community, and events. This fruitful work does not happen by itself. While the university students are the protagonists of campus mission, each part of the team is important.

I thank God for the National Board (NB), the Staff Team, the administrative assistant, the members of the National Student Coordination (CNE), the Communication Team (EqCom) and our Mission Partners, partner organizations and churches. Thank you for being a part of reaching the University with the Gospel! We thank God for his faithfulness in supporting the mission!

## **Campus Ministries**

The heart of our mission as CECE is to share, train and send to serve. Here, we will share about the different spaces and ways that we do this as a community.

### **University Groups (GU)**



The GUs are the centre of mission on the University campuses. They are small missional communities on that share Jesus through community life, acts of service, and Bible studies week after week.

Currently, we have an average of 25 GUs, who meet at 25 universities in 12 cities across the country, with an average of 128 students each week. This year the Bible studies explored the book of Job, and other texts from

the Gospels. It has been very challenging for some groups to find a time to meet and in some cases, groups continue to use a combination of in person and virtual meetings.

Lady Suconota, the new student coordinator at the Babahoyo UTB, shares the challenges of returning to in person meetings in her context.

"For me, it is the first time this semester that I have received classes in person. At first, I did not know many people to invite to the University Group, but step by step, God gave me friends who want to know his teaching and that is how I began to encourage myself and my classmates to listen and learn from the word of God together. I am grateful to God and CECE for opening a group at UTB and sharing these studies that motivate us to learn more from his word."

Students continue to use Proxi and Uncover tools as ways to share the Gospel. Work has also been done to continue strengthening a culture of invitation in the GUs and share strategies to help each GU become more visible on the University campuses.

Another form of sharing the



Gospel has been the workshops organized by each GU, which aim to respond to the specific needs of their classmates. An example of topics include: Study Tips for Success; Beyond resignation: when life is hard, and Boundaries, which allow students to share God's love in very practical ways and consolidate friendships in groups.

The Staff Team has worked hard to work with and visit the GUs in all the cities where there are University Groups. For several Staff members this means visiting groups 1-2 times per semester, with discipleship meetings via zoom. The National Director also visited students, coordinators, Staff and graduates in the cities of Guayaquil, Quito, Milagro, Cuenca, Loja, Tena, Latacunga and met the UTB Group for the first time in Babahoyo. These times of sharing are always a great joy.

### Pioneer Groups (GP)

A very important part of the proclamation, formation and service, occurs through the Pioneer Groups, which are GUs in new campuses or universities around the country. The work with GP has always been part of CECE's DNA, but it has been consolidated and grown with the constant and joyful work of Guadalupe Muñoz, who serves in a national role of coordination of GP.

We thank God for the consolidation of the group in UTB university of Babahoyo and UEB in Guaranda. We pray for Groups that have returned to pioneering work in EPN, UDLA, USFQ, UPS in Quito and the Groups in Cuenca, Portoviejo and Loja.

We are thankful for Staff members who are working with these new groups, and also for the development of a clearer process to contact new students, follow-up, train new coordinators, monitoring and growth of the GPs.

#### **National Student Coordination (CNE)**

CECE's ministerial philosophy is Students reaching Students. Student participation is the engine of our work, and the voices of the students are represented by the National Student Coordination (CNE). This team is essential to nurture and direct our mission from its bases. It is a space for leadership and service, with whom the contents and facilitation of the National Camp (CN), events and other training spaces are prepared.

"Being part of the CNE has been special; serving here filled me with the desire to continue contributing to CECE's mission in the country's universities. #### **National Camp**

After two years of online Camps, we had the joy of meeting again in person. The National Camp was held in Quito, on April 7-10 with the motto: "Job: Honest Questions to God." We shared a very enriching time of learning in community. 95 people participated, including students, professionals and staff.

We explored the book of Job together, through different spaces such as liturgy, art, small groups, workshops, games and Biblical expositions. We were happy to meet those who joined CECE during the pandemic, and it was the first time we had met in person. Walking together amid difficult questions and being a community on mission was also great!

We appreciated the excellent work of CNE, the Staff team and Ana Miriam Peralta, from COMPA Mexico, who was the speaker this year.

#### **CECE Anniversary – CECE de Corazón**

CECE de Corazón is our anniversary celebration during the month of April. In 2022, we celebrated 31 years of institutional life. It reminds us of our roots and our identity with three central elements: celebration, communication and an invitation to get involved.

CECE invests in hundreds of university students' lives each year, and the CECE Staff team is a fundamental part of accompanying students in the mission on campus. For this reason, CECE de Corazón 2022 focused on getting to know and supporting the Staff Team. Posts were shared on social media, blogs and an online celebration meeting was organized for new and existing mission partners.

#### **Training Modules**

A few years ago, Pablo Castañeda (former CECE Staff) prepared a series of training modules, with 5 themes aimed at every "militant" of the movement, and 5 themes for leaders. These materials were updated by Josué Olmedo and Ruth Hicks between the years 2011-2015. In 2022, with input from Staff, students, and professionals, we have updated two modules and created two new ones. The objective is to deepen and broaden formation processes for students and help then dialogue and respond to current issues in their university context.

The goal is to present the material in a format with more pedagogical tools for use in University Groups, personal discipleship, leadership training and in Local Groups. We hope that the modules will soon be available digitally through the CECE webpage. The modules that are being used in some University Groups are: Leadership, Healthy interpersonal relationships, Art and faith, Science and faith.

#### **Art and Faith Dialogue**

Since 2018, CECE has promoted a dialogue between Art and Word through the creation of artwork in dialogue with the biblical text being studied. This year, 5 pieces of art were presented during the National Camp in response to texts from Job. In addition, 5 pieces of art have been created in response to various biblical texts that for part of the Art and Faith training module. Thanks to Isabela Pineda for guiding this valuable process and for the significant contribution of the Initiative Logos and Cosmos from IFES (ILC).

### **Student Leaders Training (EFE)**

From 23-25 September, we had the Student Leaders Training (EFE 2022), in Riobamba. This event brought together 45 students, Staff and Graduate volunteers.



This weekend, we explored more of the book of Job with an emphasis on the themes of suffering, integrity, and wisdom for the life of the student coordinator. In addition to different workshops such as: Integral health of the coordinator, What and how of Mission in the U, how to be a visible Community in mission, Building bridges of dialogue, and much more. We also reviewed the materials for the new semester including the formation Modules, Encounters with Jesus bible studies. We are grateful for all the conversations, questions, and all we learned during EFE 2022.

"I learned about many topics: about family relationships, healthy limits, the work of a coordinator, mission in the University, and even about good nutrition and health. A topic that challenged me on a personal level and I feel that it is a reality in my University Group, is the need to be a visible community in mission... #### **World Student Day**

In October, we celebrate World Student Day (WSD), a special day that brings our global movement together to celebrate what God is doing in universities through IFES and to pray for the mission in the University.



The theme for 2022 was "Renewal", God is making all things new. There is hope! God doesn't just make things better. He makes them new. "I'm going to do something new! It's already happening, don't you see? I am making a way in the desert, and rivers in desolate places" (Isaiah 43:19).

The University Groups from all over the country carried out different

activities to pray and invite students to be part of God's work to renew all of creation, beginning with their university campuses.

#### Fondotón 2023

The feet that ran in the Fondotón take the Gospel to the University. How beautiful are those feet! This is a national initiative that brings together students, Staff, Professionals, friends and families, to run or walk together and thus raise funds for CECE training and evangelistic activities in 2023.



This year's Fondotón was back in person on Saturday, 12 November. 53 participants in 6 cities ran almost 400km together with sponsors to take the Gospel to the University.

The money raised will help students to participate in the National Camp 2023, a student to participate in the IFES World Assembly in 2023 and will support initiatives at universities. This year around \$3000 was raised.

#### **COFA Scholarships**

Since 2016, CECE is part of the COFA SCHOLARSHIP programme (Corporación Fondo Ágil) which originates from a German organization Bread for the World. We thank God for the opportunity to continue supporting the studies of 10 university students with scholarships from 2021-2024.

## **Ministry to Professionals/Alumni**

#### **Graduate Groups**

In order to explore the relationship between God's work and human work from the Scriptures, we have continued to work with professionals/alumni. This year, the Professionals group in Quito has been active thanks to the coordination of Eddy Vásquez and Karol Guallichico with an average of 7 participants. They have studied topics like: "Boundaries", the Gospel of Mark and "Celebration of Discipline".

Regular contact has been maintained with around 200 professionals from 6 cities, with whom information and invitations to CECE



events, blogs, and news are shared through WhatsApp groups. We have seen the participation and commitment of professionals in spaces such as the National Camp, being Mission Partners and as Graduate Volunteers.

We give thanks for Angie Défaz's who coordinates this area of ministry at the national level, and for her participation in the regional training process for leaders of ministry to professionals.

"For me, belonging to CECE's professionals' group has been a rewarding experience. #### **Surviving the Transition**

This is a space for students who are transitioning from university to professional life. The 10 topics in the material have three main objectives: to offer pastoral care, reflect on how to cultivate a life of faithfulness to Jesus after university, and to provide practical tools to live this transition in a healthy way. This study offers graduates training in their vocation for service and mission, with a theological-biblical perspective. In addition to inviting professionals to continue participating in various CECE spaces, serving as Staff, Graduate Volunteers and Mission Partners. During 2022, 7 young graduates participated in this series of studies during July.

#### **Professionals Gathering IFES Latin America**

How can professionals live and share their faith in their work context? This was the central theme explored at a Gathering for Professionals organized by IFES Latin America in Panama, from 27-30 October.



Here 40 people from 10 different countries of the region participated. The main teaching was given by Tim Vickers, the Director of IFES Graduate Impact, who taught the first module of Cross-current, a material designed for young professionals to continue their call to follow Jesus in the workplace through cultivating character, inspiring the intellect and the development of skills.

It was a privilege for CECE to send 4 participants: Samantha Acaro, Andrea Lanas, Wendy Panchi and Ruth Hicks, to learn and nurture CECE's work with graduates.

#### Logos and Cosmos Initiative

The dialogue between the sciences and Christian theology is at the heart of the IFES Logos and Cosmos Initiative (LCI). This initiative is being implemented in two regions: Latin America and French-speaking Africa. The purpose is to strengthen the capacities of Christian scholars, to foster dialogue and intelligent practice between their academic disciplines and Christian theology.

These academics are known in the ILC as 'catalysts', as they catalyze connections with the important conversations between the university and academia. Through them it is hoped that the IFES national movements will also be equipped and strengthened for this task.

During 2022, Daniel Castillo, Isabela Pineda and Álvaro Pérez participated in LCI, each contributing to CECE. They also participated in the LCI consultation held in Chile in September.

## **Graduate Volunteers**

We want to give thanks for the service of our team of Graduate Volunteers who have given between 8-10 hours a month of their time to serve students groups. Currently, we have 12 Graduate volunteers serving in 4 cities.

## Staff Team

CECE Pastoral Staff are the ones who invest in and train students in the University Groups to bring the Gospel to the University. There are currently13 staff on the team who work with 25 University Groups in 13 cities in Ecuador. Each Staff serves part time, and their work is supported by a network of Mission Partners who give and pray for them.


## **Communication Team**


