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


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The prophet Daniel reminds us of God's sovereignty and power when he says:

This year, we have seen how God continues to guide our mission amid the changes and challenges we face in the universities.

In 2024, I assumed the privilege of serving as National Director of CECE. It has been a time of deep learning and dependence on the Lord. Together we have studied the book of Daniel, which has taught us invaluable lessons about faithfulness, courage and trust in God in the midst of a difficult context. Daniel inspires us to be steadfast in faith, knowing that God is in control of all things.

Currently, we have 25 active University Groups (GU) in 21 universities in 12 cities across the country, with an average weekly participation of 102 students. These students, like Daniel, have decided to be witnesses of God's power in their context. They actively participate in Bible studies, workshops and community building activities that proclaim the hope of the Gospel.

I am deeply grateful to the student coordinators, Staff team, the National Board, the Communication Team, the National Student Coordination and to each Mission Partner, churches and partner organizations. With dedication and perseverance, they have made it possible for this mission to move forward. Their lives reflect the same dedication that Daniel showed in Babylon: an unwavering commitment to God's mission.

May we remain steadfast, remembering Daniel's words:

"The wise shall shine like the brightness of heaven, and those who teach many righteousness shall shine like the stars for all eternity" (Daniel 12:3).

Campus Ministries

From the University Campus

The heart of CECE's mission is to proclaim, form and send. Here we tell you about the different spaces and strategies with which we serve as a community.

University Groups (GU)

The GUs are the core of mission to the University. They are small communities in mission that share Jesus through community life, acts of service and Bible studies each week.



Currently, we have an average of 25 University Groups (GU) that meet in 22 universities in 10 cities throughout the country, with an average weekly participation of 102 students. This year we have explored, through Bible studies, the book of Daniel and the Gospel of Mark.

The energy crisis in Ecuador, which has caused power outages, has generated a notable contrast: while some face-to-face groups have been strengthened, the groups that meet virtually have faced greater difficulties in maintaining their meetings.

The following table shows the weekly participation of students in the University Groups at the national level:

During this period, several local evangelistic initiatives have taken place on university campuses. At the universities of Manabí and Babahoyo, students carried out creative activities to connect with their peers, such as sharing snacks and invitations to GU. They also used questions such as "What do you like most about being a student?" and "What do you feel worried about?" to start conversations and present the Gospel of Jesus in a relatable and relevant way.

Students continue to use tools such as Proxi and local initiatives to share the Gospel. Among the forms of proclamation are workshops and studies organized by each GU, designed to respond to the specific needs of their classmates. Some recent topics include:

- "Taking Root in Jesus: My Devotional Life."
- "Curious Faces of the Master."
- "Passion for Learning, Loving God with My Mind."
- "How to Hold On When Everything Falls Apart.

These workshops and studies not only allow us to share God's love in a practical way and show His concern for all areas of our lives, but also strengthen friendships within the groups.

The **Staff Team** has been actively working to accompany and support the GUs in all cities. For many staff, this involves visiting the groups in person once or twice a semester, complemented with discipleship meetings via Zoom.

The **National Director** has also visited students, coordinators, staff and graduates in cities such as Quito, Riobamba, Ambato, Cuenca, Loja and Guayaquil. These shared moments have been a great source of joy and renewal for all involved

Pioneer Groups (GP)

A fundamental part of the proclamation, formation and service is carried out through **Pioneer Groups (GP)**. These are University Groups (GU) that arise in new campuses or universities in the country. Working with the GPs has always been part of CECE's DNA, consolidating and growing thanks to the constant and joyful effort of Guadalupe Muñoz, who since 2020 played a national role in the coordination of the GPs.

With Guadalupe's transition to being National Director, we are pleased to announce that this work has been assumed by Miguel Peñafiel, Pastoral Staff in Guayaquil, who this year has followed up on the Pioneer Groups. We are grateful for the financial support of Breaking New Ground (IFES), which has been key to continuing this effort.

We thank God for the new groups that have been formed, such as the one at the Universidad Técnica del Norte (UTN) in Ibarra, and the reopening of groups at universities such as:

- Administration and Philosophy at the University of Guayaquil.
- UNEMI (in person) in Milagro
- Universidad Politécnica Salesiana (UPS) in Quito.
- Universidad de las Américas (UDLA) in Quito.

We continue to pray for the consolidation of the groups that are still in the pioneering phase.

COFA Scholarships

We are deeply grateful for the partnership through Scholarships from **Fondo Ágil (COFA).** During 2024, we celebrate that most of the scholarship recipients have successfully completed their studies, which allows us to achieve the expected results of the project. This concludes a wonderful process of service. It fills us with joy to know that several of these scholarship recipients will continue to serve in other roles within CECE.

In addition, COFA provided a one-off grant to support students during their thesis projects and practical internships. In October, a meeting was held with all the scholarship operators implementing the project in Ecuador to evaluate the process and share the results of the audit. In November, we held the third meeting of scholarship recipients in Baños. Tungurahua, where training was offered training on **digital marketing and financial analysis for companies**.

Pray with us that next year, **COFA** will again consider CECE to receive a new cohort of scholarship recipients.

Ministry to Professionals/Alumni

From the context of work Graduate Groups

The impact of CECE is not only reflected in university classrooms, but also extends to the various work contexts. We pray for the continued growth and strengthening of our ministry with professionals. We are deeply grateful to each professional who has contributed to the ministry and has been an essential element for the graduate groups to meet in different cities.

During 2024, we have had the participation of **25 professionals** in the National Camp. Furthermore, the graduate group in **Quito** began to meet again in August having 7 meetings. It has been challenging but also enriching to recognize the needs of graduates and to have a space for reflection and growth. Some of the topics studied include **Daniel** and the **Faith and Work** module from the Crosscurrents programme.



As part of their training, **Tommy Proaño and Jennifer Campo** participated in modules 2 and 3 online of the Crosscurrents program, coordinate by the Latin American region. Module 1 on **Faith and Work**, was replicated in Quito through virtual and face-to-face meetings held once a month.

Surviving Transition

This year, a new cycle of the **Surviving Transition** material was offered, aimed at students who are completing their university studies and entering professional life. Nineteen people from various cities participated in three virtual sessions, culminating with an in-person gathering on June 29 and 30, attended by five professionals.

This material addresses **10 key topics** related to this transitional stage, including finances, church, family and personal relationships. The main objectives are: Offer pastoral care, cultivate a life of faithfulness to Jesus after University and provide practical tools to live this stage in a healthy way.

IFES Graduate gathering -Crosscurrents Module 4 on Work - Chile

The **Crosscurrents** program, offered by IFES Graduate Impact, consists of six modules focused on the development of Christian character in the work context.

From the **23-26 October**, the second in person gathering was held in Santiago, Chile, with the theme: Generosity: Redeeming Money. **Five Ecuadorian professionals** participated and found this module to be an excellent discipleship material for professionals, which can be implemented in the graduate group in each city, encouraging learning and fellowship.

We ask for prayer that the professionals who attended may be able to plan and develop activities in their local graduate groups with wisdom. We also pray that from this group a new national coordinator will emerge to continue the work, strengthening this ministry.

Logos and Cosmos Initiative – Consultation in Quito

Quito was the place where the Logos and Cosmos Initiative held its second in person consultation. With the participation of 50 people between catalysts and external academics, this was a time to hear about the projects that are being carried out and there were also talks by Dr. Christopher Hays about Science and Faith. CECE helped with the accommodation of some participants at the CECE house and Jonathan Lema, a Graduate Volunteer, provided logistical support during the event.

Pastoral Staff Team

The ministry of the **Pastoral Staff** is vital to CECE's mission. They walk with the coordinators of the student groups, guiding, discipling and resources. With their life and work they model integrity, sharing the gospel and love for God's Word.




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

Content and Training Team

We give thanks to God for the formation of the **Contents and Training team** who lead key initiatives for the spiritual, academic and ministerial growth of students and professionals. This team is led by **Andrea Utreras**, other staff who participate are: **Isaac Peralta**, **Juan Andrade** and **Jenny Campo**.

The area of content and training is vital for CECE as they guide the design and orientation of the materials used in University Groups, ministerial training and national events such as the **National Camp** and **Student Leaders training** (EFE).



Achievements and Projects during 2024

Resources for Mission

- **Curriculum for the National Camp and Student leaders training:** The team gave structure to the workshops, biblical expositions, readings and educational materials based on the book of Daniel, focusing on leadership and forming students for mission in the university.
- **Bible Studies and Devotionals:** The team wrote a series of studies from the book of **Daniel** and **gospel of Mark** that has a great impact in the University groups. The studies included reflexive questions and practical activities that facilitate dialogue and action.
- **Instagram Live:** Two live transmissions took place which allowed participants to engage further with the bible studies and encouraged the use of resources on digital platforms.

Training and Formation

- New Staff and Graduate Volunteers: In July, this team coordinated the training for Staff Interns and Graduate Volunteers covering topics such as mission, pastoral care, communication and fund raising.
- **Staff and National Student Coordination Retreats:** This team gave leadership to strength abilities for ministry, leadership, to reflect on God's Word and to guide the students serving in CECE. This includes proceses such as **the book of the year** and the **campus exegesis tool**

Workshops and Publications

- Workshops: were taught in educational institutions, churches and universities in addition to special events such as **Surviving Transition** and the **Andean Subregional training** event.

National Board

CECE's **National Board** (NB) is responsible for giving direction to the organization, being its legal representation and ensuring that its vision and ministry impact is taking place.

The NB is made up of **ten CECE professionals** with different profiles, academic and work backgrounds, together with **two student delegates** and the **National Director**. The NB plays a key role in the national movement, being responsible for the **governance** and **administration** which includes the organizations relationship with government departments such as employment and taxes. Each board member has a solid commitment with God and with the proclamation of the Gospel in the universities and the professional context in Ecuador.

Inspired by the example of the prophet Daniel who gave testimony to his faith even in the most difficult times, the NB has taken up the challenge of giving witness through their service.



Their aim is that each administrative action will promote mission and that more professionals will join in serving in the area of governance so that the student movement and the work of the students in the universities will be strengthened.

Achievements and Challenges for the National Board during 2024

During 2024 the NB undertook regular meetings to work on key themes of governance and administration. During these meetings the National Director and student representatives shared testimonies about how university groups around the country are moving forward.

Regional Staff Training Event (EFO)

Every four years the Latin American IFES regional team organizes **a regional staff training (EFO)**, an event which brings together staff from student movements from around the Latin American regions with the aim of trainings, equipping and to give tools to grow and develop university student mission in specific contexts.

In 2024 we had the honor of being hosts for this event which has the theme:



"Kingdom weavings: the divine story, our story and the university". This event took place in Quito from 28 of April to 19 of May with the participation of 30 staff from around the region. CECE was represented by 2 delegates, **Juan Andrade** (Milagro) and **Miguel Peñafiel** (Guayaquil).

Participants had practical experiences working with groups on Ecuadorian university campuses where they led Bible studies, facilitated dialogues and did acts of service, including: workshops on mental health and integral human care, forums on science and faith, and discussions focused on contemporary issues.

"Sharing with other workers helped me to reinforce knowledge and encouraged me to continue as staff. The experiences shared with other movements in the region showed us that the Lord has control over darkness and chaos. A key lesson from the EFO was the coordinated work in national activities; it would be very enriching to implement this in our future context. The workshops and forums marked the common needs of the students, something significant for us as CECE."

Andrean Subregional Training Event

The Andean Subregional Training Event (ECUA) aims to strengthen the missionary capacities of students, staff and graduates so that they can give a faithful, fruitful and relevant witness to the Gospel in their contexts: the university and the workplace.

ECUA is organized every three years in different countries of the region. This year, it was held in **Lima**, **Peru**, from the 25-31 July.

We thank God that our movement was represented by a delegation of **25 participants**, who not only attended, but also served actively in areas such as: Workshops and logistics, Liturgy and small group leadership.

ECUA was an opportunity to share learning, strengthen relationships and renew commitment to university mission in the Andean region.

One of the greatest echoes of hope that I take with me is the conviction that, although times are difficult, there is always a divine purpose in the midst of trials. As I studied the book of Habakkuk, I came to understand that faith does not depend on circumstances, but on trusting in God's sovereignty. This encounter not only strengthened my faith, but also empowered me to be a better missionary at university. I learned how to be an active and effective witness in an academic setting, sharing my faith. This has motivated me to serve on my campus with greater passion and conviction."


